Total Estimated Green and Healthy School Program Impacts

Annually, five (5) Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) partner with local agencies and nonprofits to collaboratively replace asphalt covered schoolyards with greener, healthier spaces. Each project is tailored to the specific needs and enthusiasm of the school's community but often involves replacing seas of asphalt with green infrastructure including bioswales, native plantings, and trees as well as outdoor classrooms, improved recreational facilities and arts opportunities. The designs go beyond removing pavement to maximize benefits for communities, the environment, and local economy. As of 2023, 26 MPS schools have completed construction (two pilots) with a total of 31 schools enrolled in the program.

- '760,000+ gallons of stormwater managed through green infrastructure every time it rains, helping to reduce combined sewer overflows and basement flooding while improving urban biodiversity
- 187 trees planted, helping to provide shade that reduces heat stresses
- **191,000 square feet** of asphalt removed and replaced with publicly accessible green space
- **67,000 square feet** of native habitat restored via bioswales and prairies providing habitat for wildlife, improving pollinator populations, and supporting educational opportunities for students and community members
- \$7.1 million raised to support the five schools in Cohort 5
 - ~\$4.0 million for stormwater green infrastructure (56% of the total project)
 - Local governments: \$2.0 million (50% of GI, 28% of total)
 - State government: \$1.0 million (25% of GI, 14% of total)
 - Federal/national: \$1.0 million (25% of GI, 14% of total)
 - ~\$3.1 million for educational and recreational improvements (44% of the project)
 - MPS Foundation and Private Philanthropy: \$2.0 million (28% of total)
 - School fundraisers, ESSER, and other sources: \$1.1 million (15% of total)




